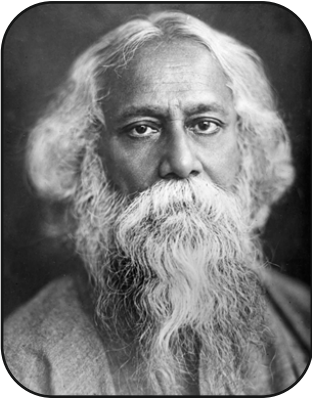

CODE OF CONDUCT

"Excellence is not a singular act but a habit. You are what you do repeatedly" With this belief, a set of guidelines in the form of rules and regulations are framed for the students, which are to be followed by them religiously and adopted as their way of life. These guidelines act as the refining fires helping the students to emerge as confident, promising and polished individuals

ACADEMIC RULES

- All students must come to school in time. The late comers may not be allowed to enter the school.
- The bell before the assembly is a signal for the students to go to the assembly.
- As soon as they are back in their classes from the assembly, students should be ready with their books and note books for the first period. They should also maintain perfect discipline. The medium of instruction in the school is bilingual as per NEP till grade V, purely English grade VI onwards., a certain amount of conversation must be carried out at home in English regularly.
- Almanac should be brought to school every day along with the given timetable. Parents are expected to look into your ward's school almanac everyday & ensure that the homework or anything else assigned for the day is done. Do countersign in the parent's column.
- Parents should ensure that the ward is fully prepared for the periodic tests and all examinations.
- Notebooks and text books should be sent as per the class timetable issued to the students.

Recommendations to Parents

- The school believes in strong partnership with parents in order to bring the best out of every child.

Maintain close contact with the school.

Please check the haircut, uniform & punctuality of your child in the morning everyday before leaving home for school.

- Do not to make any social appointments for the children during school hours.
- No student will be allowed to go home without the approval of the principal. Only under unavoidable circumstance and medical reasons, permission may be granted.
- Guide your ward to take care of their possessions.
Students are not allowed to wear jewellery to school. The school bears no responsibility for articles lost in school campus.
- Do not send ward to school in case of illness especially while suffering from a contagious disease.
- The school belongs to you where your ward is nurtured. The school should be looked upon with respect & love.
- Check your ward's school bag regularly to avoid heavy weight of bag.
- School Bag, Tiffin bag, Sweater, Shoes and other articles brought to the school, should have the name of the student and class marked on them.
- Encourage your child to take active part in all the co-curricular activities and sports held in school.
- Attend PTA meetings and access days to check the academic progress of your child and to know about your child's general behaviour in the school campus.

●Every student must have at least 85% attendance to appear in the Half Yearly or the Annual Examination. Those who fail to fulfill this criteria will be detained. Request from the defaulter in this regard will not be entertained.

GENERAL RULES

- Other than text books or library books, no books, magazines or papers should be brought to the school without prior permission of the Principal.
- Valuable articles like expensive watches, fountain pens, transistors, radios, tape recorders, camera, mobile phones or any electronic gadgets and jewellery etc. must not be brought to the school. The school is not responsible for any article lost. Lending or borrowing of money or valuable articles is strictly prohibited. In case of any loss, the school will not be responsible.
- Care must be taken of the school property. No one is allowed to scratch or spoil the desks and chairs or damage any school furniture, write or draw anything on the walls or in any way damage any article belonging to others.
- Damage done even by accident or mistake should be reported immediately to the class monitor, class teacher and to the Principal. Damage done by the student would have to be reprimand by the parents.

Students have to wear School ID card compulsorily everyday while coming to the school till he/she reaches to the final destination.

PERSONAL HYGIENE AND FOOD HABITS

- ❖ Tiffin schedule (given) has to be followed strictly children must bring a spoon and a fork with them and follow good eating habits. Only **homemade vegetarian food** is allowed in the tiffin. Junk food like biscuits, wafers chocolates, cakes etc. are not allowed.
- ❖ Every child need to carry a handkerchief and a napkin with him/her.
- ❖ Tiffin bags, water bottles, napkins and handkerchief must be washed every day.
- ❖ Parents are requested not to give dry or very spicy foodstuffs in the tiffin.

SCHOOL HOUSES



Each House is headed by a House Captain and a Vice Captain followed by a team of Prefects under different Committees. All these members are elected democratically by other students. Thus, a School Council is formed. Points are awarded to all four houses throughout the year for their best performance in Academics, Co-curricular competitions and Sports. Every house has a motto along with its logo to inspire and motivate its teachers as well as students. To bring awareness, to develop group discussions and to work unitedly on academics, co-curricular competitions and sports. House teachers and students come together to make their strategies of scoring high points. These meetings help students learn to participate in a healthy competition, develop their Team Spirit and Leadership Skills, help them grow Social.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT

- Our school provides transport facility to our students. Students can avail school bus facility, subject to the availability of seats. The routes followed by the buses will be drawn up well in advance and the parents should consult the Admin Department for the necessary details.
- GPS system has been installed in the buses to ensure safety of the students as well as to save time of the students. All the parents have the access to this system through their mobile.

School Bus Rules

- Parents should accompany the child to board and alight the school bus.
- No student will be allowed to travel by bus without school Identity Card.
- Students using the school bus are expected to be at the bus stop, at least 5 minutes before the arrival time of the bus.
- The buses will not wait for any late comers.
- Students should stay away from the main road and approach the bus only when it comes to a complete halt.
- When the bus is in motion, students must sit on their seat and refrain from leaning out, peeping out or standing on the footboard or on the seats.
- The drivers are authorized to stop the buses at the designated stops only, unless otherwise directed by the bus teacher. The list of stops is prepared keeping in view the convenience and safety of all the bus commuters and is subjected to no change.
- No diversion/extension will be entertained on existing routes.

Disciplinary Action

- Objects of any kind must not be discarded inside or thrown out of the bus.
 - No student shall act so as to divert the attention of the driver. Such students, if found guilty are liable to be debarred from travelling by the school bus.
 - Students will be held responsible for any damage to the bus caused by negligence or vandalism.
 - Unruly behavior like shrieking and shouting inside the bus is strictly prohibited.
 - List of students and stops with contact numbers will be available in the respective buses.
 - Teachers coming by bus are responsible for maintaining discipline in the buses. Any serious offence must be reported to the Principal immediately.
- Note : Any change in bus timings will be informed through ERP messages only.**

GENERAL RULES FOR EXAMINATION

- Attendance is compulsory for all exams held during the year.
- A minimum attendance of 85% of the total number of working days in each semester is compulsory for securing a rank as per merit list. Even on medical grounds the child cannot remain absent for more than 20% of the total number of working days in each semester, or else the child will be detained in the same Grade.
- Students who report late for any of the exams will not be given any extra time for answering the question papers.
- Students who score less than 33% of marks in any of the main subject (English, Hindi, Marathi, Maths, Science and Social Science) will be detained in the same grade.
- No Re-Exam Policy. Students percentage would be considered in the Final Consolidated Result if a medical certificate is provided, but such students will not be considered for the merit list.
- A request for report cards before result declaration will not be entertained.
